

# BENEFIT

Part of Speech: NOUN



DEFINITION: An advantage or profit gained from something.

SYNONYMS: Good, well-being, ease, comfort, convenience

It was a great **benefit** to have an umbrella during the rainstorm because I didn't want to miss the soccer game.



# PROHIBIT

PART OF SPEECH: **VERB**

DEFINITION: Formally forbid, by law, rule, or other authority.

SYNONYMS: forbid, ban, bar, outlaw, veto

Mom and Dad prohibit, or forbid, T.V. after 9:00 p.m.



# REPEAL

## Part of Speech: verb

To revoke, cancel, or get rid of.

We went to Mr. Blasquez to repeal the school rule of no hats worn inside.



# PREVIOUSLY

Before

Previously, we were 4th graders.

# ADVANTAGES

Condition or circumstance that puts one in favor or in a superior position.



It was an advantage to have a moat around your castle in Ireland during time of war.

# MIDST

DEFINITION: The middle point or part

SYNONYMS: middle, heart, center, midpoint



There was a red apple in the midst of all the green apples.

# TEMPORARY

For a short amount of time.

Your time in 5th grade is temporary compared to your entire life.



# OBJECTED

Definition: to disagree with

The President objected or vetoed the bill.



# CONTRARY

## Part of Speech: Adjective

DEFINITION: Opposite in nature, direction, or meaning.

SYNONYMS: Stubborn, opposite, defiant, uncooperative



Contrary to what the football coach advised, the girl decided to go out for the football team anyway.



# REBELLIOUS

Part of Speech: Adjective

DEFINITION: Showing a desire to resist authority or control.



The girl was rebellious when she ignored the rule and sat on the national memorial anyhow.

SYNONYMS: Defiant, disobedient, unruly
