bondage

Definition-being under the control of another person against your will






Example-slave

Non-example-free person

Sentence-Slaves were in **bondage** when they were forced to work against their will.

provisions

Definition-necessary supplies, especially food



Examples: water bottle, first-aid kit, granola bars, and soup mix

Non-examples: I-pad, toys, jewelry

Sentence-Provisions are the food and supplies that you need for travel, at home, or in a survival situation.

aspects

Definition-parts of something



Examples-characteristics, features, details

Non-examples-a whole? something with no parts?

Sentence-Diet, sleep, and exercise are three important <u>aspects</u> of health.

apprentice

Definition-someone learning a trade



Examples: protégé, trainee, rookie

Non-Examples: expert, professional, veteran

Sentence- A sorcerer's **apprentice** is learning the art of magic.

dexterity

Definition-skill in performing tasks especially with the hands



Examples: ability, talent, proficiency, knack

Non-Examples: inability, awkwardness, clumsiness

Sentence- Playing computer games can improve your manual **dexterity**.

tentative

Definition-not certain or fixed



Examples: iffy, not sure, temporary

Non-Examples: confident, certain, sure

Sentence- The puppy was **tentative** about entering the water.

influential

Definition-having the power to change things



Examples: powerful, dominant, strong

Non-Examples: weak, ineffective, unmoving

Sentence-<u>Influential</u> people can inspire you to do great things.

contributions

Definition-things given toward a common purpose



Examples: donation, gift, offering

Non-Examples: loss, decrease, subtraction

Sentence-CFT kids make <u>contributions</u> for Stuff the Bus, Pennies for Pasta, and the school carnival.

authorities

Definition-people who are in charge





Examples: principals, police officers, teachers, parents

Non-examples: students, kids, prisoners

Sentence-The villagers turned the prisoners over to military **authorities**.

persuade

Definition-to convince someone to do or believe something





Examples: coax, convince, win over

Non-examples: stop, discourage, prevent

Sentence-I am going to **persuade** my parents to buy me a puppy.
